

Golf Etiquettes

PRIOR TO PLAY

- Arrive earlier before your Tee Time to check-in, and to get your Green Fee.
- Hang your Green Fee on your golf bag.
- Follow the instructions of the **Starter & Marshal**.
- Have no more than 4 Players in one Flight.
- Be prepared to have others join you if have less than 4 players in your Flight.
- Be ready to play when it is your time to tee off.
- Use course scorecard for reference on yardage, hole layout, Maps, and local rules.

ON THE TEE

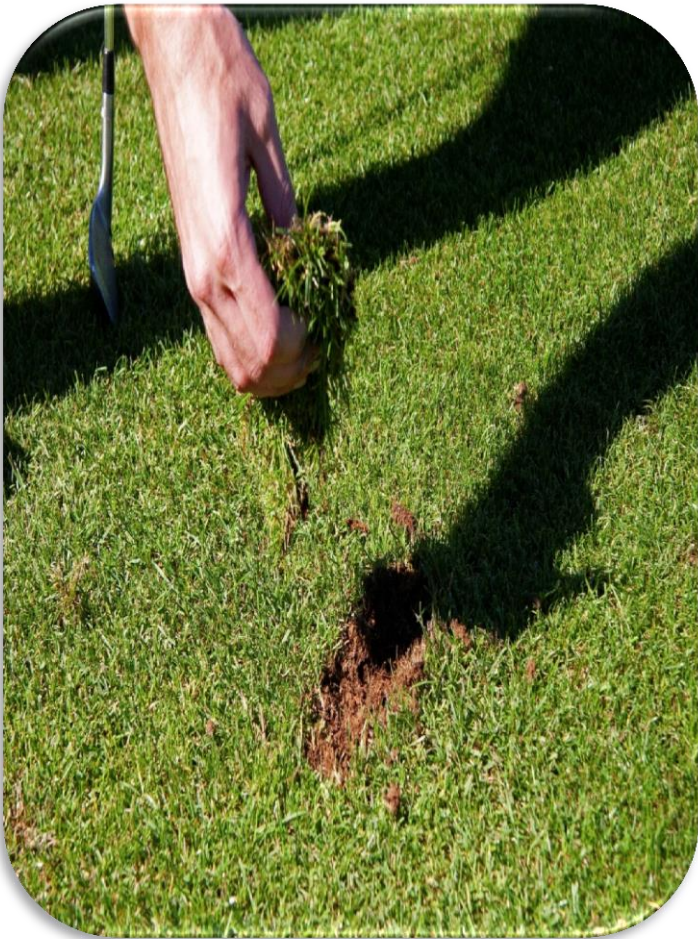
- Decide which way of starting your flight is going to follow "**Honour System** or **Ready Golf**" , considering Tees order (Pro Tee, Men Tee, Ladies Tee, Kids Tee).
- Mark your ball so that you can identify it.
- The playing golfer on the Tee while other golfers stay by side.



- The most important thing is **Safety**, so before start playing make sure that "No one near to you or in front of you to avoid hitting someone with your club or with your ball".
- Hit ONLY when golfers ahead of you are out of range.
- Stand still, quiet and facing other golfers while they are hitting.
- Watch where all balls go to avoid time spent looking for lost balls.
- Yell the warning "FORE!" if your ball is heading toward another golfer.
- No golf cart, and No trolley on the tee.
- Take off your Tee after playing.

On THE FAIRWAY

-Repair your Divots.



-Walk directly to your ball unless you reach someone else's ball first.

-Don't do many practice swing.

-Player furthest from the hole usually plays first but golfers out of range of the group in front can play first, if ready.

-Keep pace of play all the time.

-Place your bag or cart to the right of you when hitting.



-Assist playing partners when needed by bringing clubs, finding lost balls, etc.

-Follow Local Rules & posted riding cart rules.

IN THE BUNKER

- Step in Bunkers from the shortest point to your ball.
- Only one player in the Bunker.
- Rake your footprints and your shot mark at Bunkers after playing.
- Smooth the sand in the right way.



ON THE GREEN

- Avoid pulling carts or driving carts across the green, always keep the golf cart away from the green.
- Place your bag or cart between the green and the next tee to save time.
- Take all clubs that you may need.
- Repair your pitch marks.



- Players begin putting when all balls are on the green.
- The person furthest away from the hole putts first.

-Mark your ball if it is in the path of another player's ball.



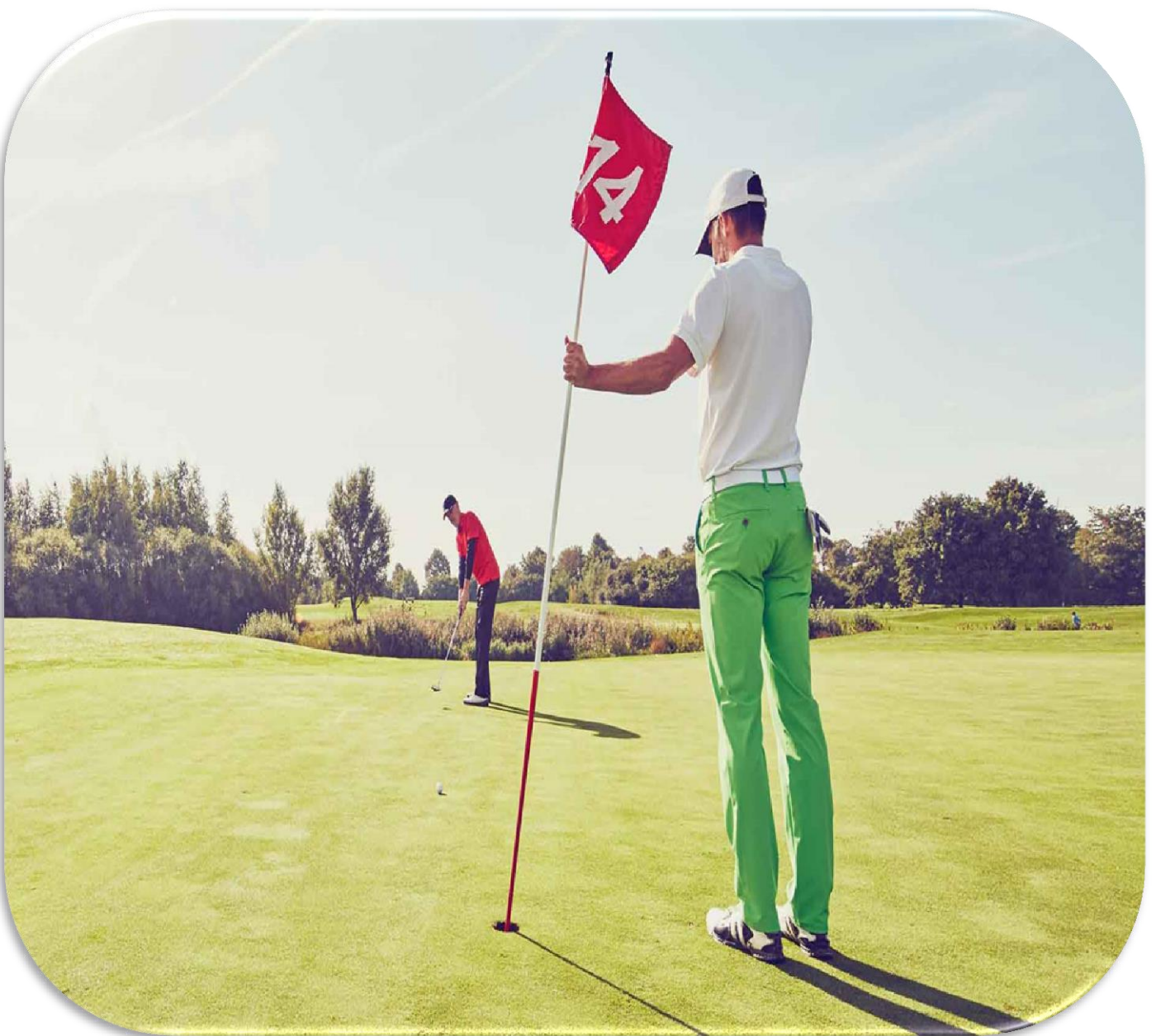
-Avoid stepping on another player's Put line.

-No one stands behind or in front of the Put line while the golfer is playing.

-Watch your shadow.



- You can play putting with flagstick on or off , If you like to put it off , so don't put it on any **Put line** and put it by the green side and after all players finishing their putting someone should Put on the flagstick back.
- On long putts, have another player attend the flagstick.



- Record all scores on the way to the next tee.

GENERAL TIPS

- Take care of the golf course condition.
- Golf Dress Code/Attire/Clothes.
- Use the proper Golf shoes (Golf shoes kinds).
- Every player should play with his own golf clubs.
- Silent your mobile during the game.
- Play a provisional ball if there is any doubts.
- Anger Management, don't lose your temper, be calm, don't say bad words if you make bad shot.
- Say nice words if someone hit good shot.
- Tipping Caddies for their good job.
- Be ready to hit when it is your turn.
- Limit your practice swings.
- Take plenty of clubs with you to your ball when leaving your bag or riding cart.
- Avoid long discussions regarding golf rules and you can ask the club organizers at the end of your game.

- Watch all balls until they stop rolling to avoid lengthy searches.
- If asked you can advise regarding Distance and Pin position.
- Use a fixed object as a reference point.
- All players should go directly to their own ball and play when ready.
- If your flight is Slow , let faster Flights play through.
- If you have a bad day and making many shots , so it is no problem to pick up your ball and go to the next Tee to keep pace of play .
- At the end of the golf round, golf players should thank each other, shake hands, and say some nice words to each other.
- Remember, by keeping pace of play you make the game more enjoyable for everyone.
